#### **Brief History:**

Dumkal College was founded on 21st September, 1999 by the order of the Government of West Bengal. It is affiliated to be University of Kalyani since its inception. The college starts its functioning with a handful of students initiating their classes in B.T. High School, Dumkal. However, today's picture is one of complete transformations. It is a co-education college and it is the only institution within the locality which ran from the very beginning with all three streams- Arts, Science and Commerce. Struggle is still there – but it is no more a simple struggle for survival rather a content Endeavour to attain excellence.

#### **Location:**

This college is situated at Basantapur, a village with a close proximity to the Indo-Bangladesh border under Dumkal Subdivision. The college is connected by a black topped surface road with Dumkal Bus stand. It is, therefore, conveniently connected with both Berhampore and Jalangi by road.

#### **Admission Qualifications:**

#### **Eligibility & Recognized Boards:**

A candidate may be admitted to the first semester of four-year (Eight Semester) VG-Courses of Studies on passing Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination in general conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or an equivalent examination conducted by other State Board/Council, or The W.B. Council of Rabindra Open Schooling, or The National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) recognized by the Distant Education Bureau(DED) subject to fulfillment of the conditions mentioned below:

#### **Candidates from other Boards:**

In case of other Boards/Councils, a candidate shall have to pass in five recognized subjects, of which one shall be English, of full marks not being less than 100 each. A candidate passing in less than five subjects shall not be eligible for admission.

#### **Candidates from Vocational Stream:**

However, Candidates passing Higher Secondary examination in vocational stream conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Technical & Vocational Education & Skill Development (WB SCTVE&SD) or any other equivalent Board/ Council are also eligible for admission provided that the candidate must have passed in 5 (five) recognized subjects, of which one shall be English.

\*\*\* Candidates shall be allowed for admission within 03 (three) consecutive academic sessions including the year of passing the previous qualifying examination. (For example: candidates passing H.S. Examination in the year 2021 will get last chance of admission in the academic session 2023-2024)

#### **Programmes of Study:**

#### There shall be following one type of Under-Graduate Programme-

- 4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with Research)
- As per the Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes, developed by the UGC there will be provisions for awarding UG Certificate, UG Diploma and Basic UG Degree with Major. Separate Rules/Guidelines will be framed in this regard.
- For 4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research), a student can choose a research stream in the fourth year, subject to fulfillment of all conditions; laid down by the UGC for implementation of NEP and Curriculum Credit Frame Work.

#### **Minimum Eligibility Criteria for Admission:**

- i) 4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with Research): A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent Examination from other Boards / Councils with at least four subjects including English as Compulsory Subject of 100 marks is eligible to take admission to the UG-Courses of studies on the basis of merit and available vacancy of the particular subject(s) of the concerned college.
- ii) Aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects, in order of marks secured by a candidate. Marks obtained in Compulsory Environmental Studies (if any) shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks.
- iii) A candidate shall be allowed to pursue any one of the Programmes in a particular Academic Session. At the initial stage, every student has to choose one Major subject and two Minor subjects.

#### Special conditions for admission to a few Major/ Minor Courses:

#### **Chemistry:**

A candidate shall be allowed to take up Major/Minor in Chemistry only if he/she has passed in Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination.

#### **Mathematics:**

A candidate shall be allowed to take up Major/Minor in Mathematics only if he/she has passed in Mathematics in the previous qualifying examination. A candidate who has passed in Business Mathematics is not eligible for admission to Mathematics Major Course.

#### **Physics:**

A candidate shall be allowed to take up Major/Minor in Physics only if he/she has passed in Physics and Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination.

#### **Facilities Available:**

#### a) Library:

The college library has a vast collection of text books, books of regular references, rare books and useful journals. The library is mainly funded by U.G.C. grants, (M.P. and M.L.A. Funds) State Government grants, available from time to time and the college fund as well. The college authority is endeavouring to overcome the paucity of space in the library and to renovate the building where the library is situated. Some

of the departments have seminar libraries where students can interact with the teachers directly.

#### b) Laboratories:

The college has well-equipped laboratories for the departments of Physics, Chemistry, Geography, Computer Science and Mathematics. The laboratories have recently been renovated and modernized to meet the demands of the latest syllabi. A number of computers have been installed in these departments. Some departments are equipped with modern teaching aids like overhead projectors and audio system.

#### c) Sports & Games:

The College has a spacious common room for students will the facility of indoor games. The college regularly participate in various outdoor sports, such as football, cricket and athletics in different levels. The college regularly holds the annual sports during winter. The Students, Union of the college plays a major role in arranging and conducting the various games and other sporting activities.

#### d) Academic Tour:

The educational tour of Geography department is arranged by the concerned department in every academic year. Tours are compulsory and a part of the curriculum.

#### e) Students Health Home and Students Counselling cell:

All students of the college are members of students of Health Home and they can get all sorts of medical facilities from the same.

#### f) Canteen / Students' Common Room:

The college has two spacious students' common rooms one for boys and another for girls and a canteen for all.

#### g) College Magazine and college Journal:

The college magazine (Trinankur) is published annually with the objective of nourishing and giving exposure to the literary prowess of the students. The budding poets, writers and essayists get ample scope of developing and expressing their innate literary qualities. The Editorial Board takes every care to maintain a high standard of publication. Regular publication of wall magazine is also a platform for the students to express their literary talent and innovative thinking. The college authority has planned for the publication of College journal with ISBN no.

#### h) Seminars and Debate:

The College organizes seminars and debates on varied topics of academic and social interest where students and teachers have the opportunity to interact with each other.

Eminent educationalists are invited as resource persons to deliver lectures on different issues.

#### i) National Service Scheme (N.S.S.):

Dumkal College participates in the National Service Scheme under the University of Kalyani, sponsored by the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India. A Programme Officer, assisted by an Advisory Committee, oversees the NSS activities. The aims and objectives of the NSS are to involve urban rural youth in constructive and development programmes in the rural sector, participation in the socio-economic life of the community, to foster the notion of national integration among the students and such other activities. Every year volunteers from among the students are enrolled and after completion of 120 hours of works, certificates are awarded by the college. Regular programme different relevant aspects are going on with special camps under NSS scheme.

#### j) National Cadet Corps (NCC):

With its motto of "Unity and Discipline" the National Cadet Corps aims to create organized, trained and motivated youths by developing qualities of leadership, team spirit, secular outlook, ideas of selfless service and spirit of adventure. The activities of the NCC can be broadly divided into Institution Training, Community Development Programme cum Social Service Activities, Youth Exchange Programme and Adventure Training and Sports. NCC "B" and "C" certificates, the cadets receive, benefit them in the form of reserved vacancies for commission in the Defense Forces, i.e., in the Indian Army, Indian Navy and the Indian Air Force. Scholarships are also available for deserving NCC cadets who have excelled in academics. The college unit provides the opportunity for the students to be a part of this unique organization and the cadets of the college unit actively take part in the Independence Day and Republic Day Parade.

#### k) Scholarships:

Depending on their results, the students of the college will be able to apply for the Scholarship like National Scholarship, S.C., S.T. scholarship, and grants from college.

#### 1) Free & half free Studentship:

This facility extended to a very limited number of students (only 10% of total strength of 1st, 2nd and 3rd year) on the basis of their results in previous examination, regular attendance in the classes, along with their economic condition and at present only to poor but highly meritorious Students as verified and recommended by teachers of specified departments

#### m) Social and Cultural Activities:

A host of social and cultural activities mark the college calendar. The students' Union actively helps the college authority in arranging the annual Social and Cultural Meet, holding interclass debate competitions. All these activities aim at developing a sense of brotherhood among students of the college to make them good citizens. The college students are competent enough for taking participation in drama, elocution, and other cultural activities.

#### n) Students' Union:

The Students' Union is a democratically elected body of the class representatives along with the Principal who hold the office of the president of the Students' Union. The election to the union is held every year as per college constitution. The Union takes the responsibility of publishing the Annual Magazine, Common Room activities, and other social and cultural and sports events etc.

The basic duty of the Union is to voice the demands of the students, create and maintain a healthy academic atmosphere, be involved in developmental activities of the college and foster a good relationship between the teachers and the taught. The student union follows the constitution as circulated from K.U. at present.

Note: However, as per directives from the concerned authority of the Government of West Bengal election to Students' Union has been kept in abeyance and thus the functions and works of the college Students' Union does not exist at present.

#### **Teachers' council:**

A teacher council constituted as per the statute of Kalyani University, consisting of all whole-time permanent members of the teaching staff, assists college administration by active participation in various academic and administrative functioning of the college.

#### **Non-Teaching Staff Council:**

The members of the non-teaching staff council help the administration of the college through their active participate and representation at all times. They are an integral part of the college administration and their role in running the college smoothly is very important.

#### **Guardians' forum / parent Teacher Meetings:**

Different departments of the college meet guardians / parents of the students to interact with them regarding the performance progress and problems of the students. Suggestions from guardians / parents are welcome regarding academic activities of their wards at the same time they (guardians/parents) are made aware about their responsibilities towards their wards.

The intention is there to form a Guardians' Forum calling them in groups at a time and have them interact with teachers and administration.

#### **Alumni Association:**

Dumkal College has an Alumni Association (established on 2008). Every ex-student is eligible to be a member of the committee. The Alumni Associations takes active interest in the various social and cultural activities of the college.

#### **Administration:**

The administration of the college runs under the dynamic leadership of the members of the Governing Body of the college. The improvement and well-being of the college stands under their judicious decisions and care.

The Teachers' Council and College office help the Principal, through their innovating ideas and suggestions; Authority tries to implement the same for the overall improvement of the college.

#### conduct for Students

- Identity Card: After admission a student is required to get an identity card signed by the Officer-in Charge of the college, containing information about the student concerned. The identity card is a proof of his/her status as a student of Dumkal College, Murshidabad. The possession of this card entitles him/her to the rightful privilege as a student of this college. Students must carry the identity card provided by the college during college hours. A student should produce the identity card on prosecution at any time for any reason. The loss of college identity card should be reported to the college authority.
- Serious notice is taken of unwarranted absence from classes and college examinations. The College Authority reserves the right to strike off the name of the student if he / she is found to be continuously absent without intimation for 21 days after the commencement of classes.
- A student absent from college for three continuous months without notice will be struck off from the college roll.
- Students of this college will abide by the rules of the college and must maintain the decorum. Polite and respectful behaviour towards the teachers and nonteaching staff of the College and their fellow students is expected from a student of this College.
- Students must not indulge in ragging in any form. The College maintains a zero-tolerance policy towards ragging.
- Admission to the college binds a student to follow college rules and directions that may be issued from time to time by the college authority.
- Attendance: Students are required to attend the lectures regularly and punctually. At least 75% attendance is required to appear in final examination. #### Code of conduct for Teachers, official & support staff

➤ Every teacher shall, at all times, maintain integrity, be devoted to duty and also be honest and impartial in his / her official dealings. A teacher shall, at all times, be well-mannered in his / her dealings with the management, with other members of staff, students and with members of the public.

- ➤ Unless otherwise stated specifically in the terms of appointment, every teacher is a whole-time teacher of the Institute and may be called upon to perform such duties as may be assigned to him / her by the competent authority beyond the scheduled working hours and on holidays and Sundays.
- A teacher shall be required to maintain the scheduled hours of work during which he / she must be present at the place of his / her duty. No teacher shall be absent from duty without prior permission. Even during leave or vacation, with the prior permission of the competent authority, whenever leaving the station, a teacher should inform the principal in writing, through the concerned Head of the Department, or the principal, if the teacher happens to be Head of the Department, giving the contact details at which, he / she will be available during the period of his / her absence from the station.
- ➤ No teacher shall take part in politics, or be associated with any political party or organization which takes part in political activity, nor shall subscribe, aid or assist in any manner any political movement or activity.
- No teacher shall make any statement, publish or write through any media which has effect of an adverse criticism of any policy or action of the Institute.
- ➤ No teacher, except with the prior permission of the competent authority, engage, directly, or indirectly in any trade or business or any private tuition, or undertake any employment outside his official assignments. - A teacher, against whom insolvency proceedings commenced in a court of law, shall forthwith report full facts thereof to the Institute.
- A teacher, against whom criminal proceedings are initiated in a court of law, shall immediately inform the competent authority of the Institute regarding the details thereof.
- ➤ No teacher shall, except with the prior sanction of the competent authority, have recourse to any court of law or to the press / media for / against any official act of the Institute.
- ➤ Every teacher shall be governed by these rules and shall be liable for consequences in the event of any breach of the rules by him / her.
- A teacher who commits any offence or dereliction of duty, or does an act detrimental to the interests of the Institute, is subject to an enquiry and punishment by the competent authority. Any teacher who is aggrieved with the decision of the competent authority may appeal against such punishment or decision, within 15 days of the receipt of the orders of the decision, to the Governing Body and the decision of the Governing Body thereon is final.
- No teacher shall engage in strike or incitement thereto or in similar activities such as absence from work, or neglect of duties, or participate in hunger strike etc. Violation of this rule will amount to misconduct and will attract deterrent punishment.
- All the teachers shall handover their original certificates like SSC, Intermediate, M. Sc, PhD etc. to the principal at the time of joining duty.

- ➤ The institute gives utmost priority for discipline and every staff, is bound to follow the rules and regulations of the institute and maintain strict discipline.
